"I am excited to be back in Northeastern Colorado! I look forward to furthering my knowledge of the electrical grid and REAs."




DOE Awards HEA Funds for Wildfire Resilience Project


If your account doesn't currently have a description or if it needs to be updated, please contact us. Ensuring this information is accurate helps us serve you more efficiently.
